- Not for profit organizations


Background

CFPA-E

- Iinks nationally recognized fire protection, safety & security organizations in 18 European countries
- was founded in 1974
- work is based on the extensive resources of its members

Objectives of CFPA Europe

- To encourage the exchange of information in relation with protection of life and property
- To facilitate co-operation between members for undertaking joint programs

The Confederation has extensive resources within its members, and they include engineers and technicians with competencies in various fields such as:


- fire prevention

Cooperation on Guidelines

Nordic FPA meeting year 2000 – They decided to cooperate and produce Fire Safety Guidelines together

- Idea was presented at CFPA E's General Assembly 2001
- After discussion all members asked the Nordic countries to do the work in the whole CFPA E
- A Commission for Fire Safety Guidelines was form and the first meeting September 2001 in Sweden
- First ratified Guideline in the autumn 2002
- Year 2005 started work with Security
- In 2011 started work with Natural Hazards

Guidelines

- Guidelines are developed and ratified
- All Guidelines are free on the website
- Guidelines can be endorsed by other organizations



Guidelines



- 36 ratified fire safety guidelines
- 10 ratified security guidelines
- 6 ratified natural hazard guidelines

Fire safety – 36 ratified Guidelines Some few examples




We network to help
